

TOWN OF BRISTOL
PUBLIC HEARING-2014 BUDGET
REGULAR MEETING
OCTOBER 15, 2013

PRESENT: Robert A. Green, Jr, Bruce Harter, David Parsons, Alden Favro, Thomas Stevens, Ron Wilson, Sharon Miller, William Kenyon, Atty

The Supervisor called the Public Hearing to order at 7:00 PM. Privilege of the floor was given to Jeffrey Bills, President of the Bristol Vol. Fire Dept.. He spoke on their proposed budget. They are requesting a 1% increase over last year's request. The amount budgeted for their snow removal will be removed if the Town agrees to handle the plowing at the firehouse. The Supervisor advised the Board that we had just received today, the figures from the Town of Canandaigua for the water district. He advised the Board that there maybe a slight adjustment to their budget. A motion was made by Bruce Harter and seconded by David Parsons and carried to close the hearing on the budget.

Privilege of the floor was given to Douglas Brooks of Gregg Road. He expressed his concerns to the Board on hydrofracking and its effect it could have for our town. Nick Cohen addressed the Board on what were "bench marks" made by the Board and how are we progressing. The Supervisor advised him that the Focus Committee came up with the proposed "bench marks" and the Town Board is working diligently with Boylan Code on developing guidelines for heavy industry traffic. Extra meetings are being planed by the Planning Board so we can move forward on zoning regulations. He also expressed a concern about the use of fracking fluids on town highways. The Supervisor will investigate pertinent state guidelines. Peter Jones of Gregg Road suggested that maybe another committee is necessary to help the Planning Board with their busy schedule.

Privilege of the floor was closed.

A motion was made by Al Favro and seconded by David Parsons and carried to accept the Sept. 9th and Oct. 1st minutes as presented.

A motion was made by David Parsons and seconded by Tom Stevens and carried to pay the following bills:

A motion was made by Tom Stevens and seconded by David Parsons and carried to accept the Supervisor's financial report for the month of September

Bulk water sales for the month of September were \$800.00.

Nate Harvey, Chairman of the Planning Board, submitted his monthly report. Their recommendation to the Town Board is not to enact a Noise Ordinance, they fee that it would be hard to enforce. There are new SEQR forms that are required to be used. Several members are attending a training session on them.

Sandy Riker, Secretary for the Code Enforcement Officer, submitted her monthly report. Seven permits were issued. The property at 4158 Elm Tree has been cleaned up and the rubbish removed. A violation notice has been sent out for a property on County Road 2 and the investigation is still on going.

Tom Stevens reported that he is receiving quotes for the tennis court to repair the surface. He stated that he would chair the Fun Day Committee next year.

Ron Wilson, Hwy Supt. submitted his monthly report. The new 2014 Ford F250 has been ordered. They changed a culvert on Deuel Road and built some berms along the edge of the road. He has put together a specs sheet for a new 2015 cab & chassis.

The Town Clerk submitted her monthly report. She is checking with Canandaigua National Bank about possibly allowing them to collect property taxes during the month of January. Some questions were raised and be answered at the next meeting.

A motion was made by Al Favro and seconded by Bruce Harter and carried to accept all departmental reports.

A motion was made by David Parsons and seconded by Tom Stevens and carried to reappoint Stephen Pappano to the Board of Assessment Review. His term to begin 10/01/2013 and expires 09/31/2017.

A motion was made by Tom Stevens and seconded by David Parsons and carried to extend our contract with the Rochester Computer Recycling & Recovery Program. The Rochester Computer Recycling & Recovery Program is going to charge by the pound to recycle Cathode Ray Tube TV's and monitors, Cathode Ray Tube TV's and monitors will no longer be accepted at the transfer station for recycling.

William Kenyon, Town Attorney, explained the process for the Board of Health to follow when they are required to convene.

A motion was made by David Parsons and seconded by Al Favro and carried to authorize the Town Clerk, as licensing agent, to enter into an agreement between the NYS DEC and the Town of Bristol to issue licenses for the privilege of hunting and fishing in NYS.

A motion was made by Tom Stevens and seconded by Bruce Harter and carried to authorize the Supervisor to sign the Snow & Ice contracts with Ontario County.

A motion was made by Bruce Harter and seconded by Al Favro and carried to hold a Public Hearing on Local Law #2-Tax Cap Override\for 2015 at 7:00 PM on December 9, 2013.

A motion was made by Bruce Harter and seconded by David Parsons and carried to adopt the 2014 Preliminary Budget, pending receiving final Water District figures, from the Town of Canandaigua.

A motion was made by Al Favro and seconded by David Parsons and carried to adjourn the meeting at 8:20 PM.
