

TOWN OF BRISTOL
REGULAR MEETING
SEPTEMBER 9, 2013

PRESENT: Robert A. Green, Jr, Bruce Harter, David Parsons, Alden Favro, Thomas Stevens, Ron Wilson, Sharon Miller, William Kenyon, Atty

The Supervisor Green called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Privilege of the floor was given to Lynn Cronise, of Redtail drive. She commented that she was pleased with the progress Boylan Code is making with drafting regulations on zoning for high volume hydrofracking. She hopes that it continues to progress the way it looks like it is headed. Nick Cohen of South Hill asked for updates to the minutes of the meeting with Boylan Code be posted on the website. Sandy said it would be done when meetings were scheduled.

Privilege of the floor was closed.

A motion was made by Al Favor and seconded by Bruce Harter and carried to accept the minutes as presented.

A motion was made by David Parsons and seconded by Bruce Harter and carried to pay the following bills:

A motion was made by Tom Stevens and seconded by Bruce Harter and carried to accept the Supervisor's financial report for the month of August.

Bulk water sales for the month of August were \$350.00.

Nate Harvey, Chairman of the Planning Board, submitted his monthly report. They approved a minor subdivision on Dugway Road for Thomas Main. They tabled the request of Michael Koelsch's request for a six foot trail to access a portion of his property until further information is obtained. A new definition for Home Occupation was drafted along with other changes and will be incorporated when our zoning regulations are updated.

Sandy Riker, Secretary for the Code Enforcement Officer, submitted her monthly report. Seven permits were issued. There was no ZBA meeting. A letter of violations was sent to the owner of a residence on Elm Tree Road,

Ron Wilson, Hwy Supt. submitted his monthly report. The wedging and shoulder work on road has been completed. They have been working on drainage problems areas by ditching and installing check dams to slow the flow of water to cut down on the erosion caused by the Spring thaw and rain. A motion was made by Bruce Harter and seconded by David Parsons and carried to allow the highway department to go on to private property at 7404 Logan Road to clean out a cross pipe that has washed and loaded the creek bed with materials that is now causing water to flow on to private property. Ron has received a price on a 2014 Mack chassis on state contract from Onondaga County for \$124,999.89. He also received a quote from VanBortel Ford for a 2014 F-250 with plow for \$27,680.96. No decisions on purchasing either vehicle was made at this time.

The Town Clerk submitted her monthly report.

A motion was made by Al Favro and seconded by Tom Stevens and carried to accept all departmental reports.

Diana Thorn, Director of the Bristol Library gave a presentation to the Board.

The Supervisor advised the Board that we received notification from Holly Stoddard, Richmond Recreation Director, that their request for the 2014 budget will be \$4,912.50.

A request was received from a resident on Kear Road asking the Board to consider placing a speed limit near the 4H Camp. A motion was made by Tom Stevens and seconded by David Parsons and carried to petition the NYS DOT to investigate the traffic conditions on Kear Road to see if a speed reduction area is needed in the area of the 4H Camp.

A motion was made by Bruce Harter and seconded by Al Favro and carried to direct the Planning Board to develop zoning laws pertaining to High Volume Hydrofracking (Heavy Industry) as described in the NYS SGEIS. At the present time, heavy industry is not addressed in the zoning laws of the Town of Bristol.

Discussion was held on a dog enumeration being done in 2014. It was decided not to do one until it is further discuss what other towns will be doing if the Human Society does not participate in the program.

The Supervisor advised the Board that he is on a county committee to update the Hazardous Mitigation Plan. The county has received a state grant of \$75,000. To update the current plan.

Tom Stevens advised the Board that the Honeoye Boy Scouts Troop 55 will be assisting him with planting trees in the Patriots Park.

A motion was made by Tom Stevens and seconded by Bruce Harter and carried to adjourn the meeting at 8:10 PM.

A presentation on the STAR Registration Program was given by Gary Drake.
